Disengagement of YAP Beneficiaries

In October 2022, the Forestry Commission submitted a proposal to the Ministry of Lands

& Natural Resources requesting approval to review the YAP for improved efficiency and

effectiveness. Again, in January 2023, a committee which was set up to review the YAP

submitted a report recommending a reduction in the number of beneficiaries to 2,000.

This was aimed at ensuring efficiency and keeping the numbers at a level that would

guarantee regular payment of allowances. However, no official response was received

from the Ministry. On 19th February 2025, the Commission again wrote to the Ministry

requesting approval to phase out the YAP with the view to review the Project and develop

a new and improved youth-centred program with sustainable and clear budget lines to

support the implementation of the Government's Tree for Life Reforestation Initiative.

On 27th February 2025, the Ministry of Lands and Natural Resources approved the FC's

proposal to phase out the YAP by 31st March 2025. Pursuant to this approval, the FC has

directed all Regional / District Managers to issue disengagement letters to all beneficiaries

under their jurisdiction following due process.

The Way Forward

The Ministry of Lands and Natural Resources is working closely with the Ministry of

Finance to ensure that all validated and due outstanding beneficiary allowances are paid

in due course.

The Ministry of Lands and Natural Resources and the Forestry Commission express their

gratitude to the beneficiaries under the YAP for their contribution towards the growth,

restoration and protection of the nation's forests and wish them well in their future

endeavours, which may include opportunities under the upcoming Tree for Life

Reforestation Initiative.
